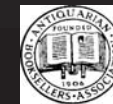

All books are sold as complete unless otherwise stated. Any item found not to be matching its description may be returned within seven days of receipt.

**Postage and packing** are charged extra at cost, but all books are insured in transit free of charge.

**Payment** may be made by cheque or credit card, and all major cards are accepted – EUROCARD, MASTERCARD, MAESTRO, SOLO, VISA (credit and debit cards), SWITCH and AMERICAN EXPRESS. 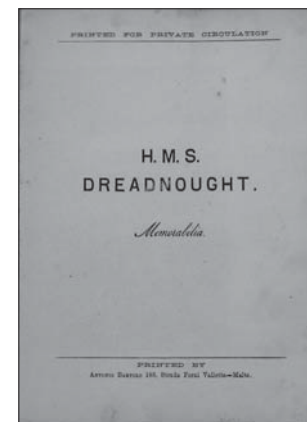

Rare, and possibly unique. This extraordinary manual must have been written and printed in Dreadnought's early years stationed in Valletta Harbour. It contains every conceivable detail relating firstly to her construction, layout, armament, and engines, and secondly to the "Station Bill", covering the composition, disposition and organisation of all manner of fire drills, landing parties, diving parties, torpedo boats, sea boats, flooding and stowage of magazines (with comprehensive lists of ordnance, including a folding chart), stores, electrical systems, orders for boats crews, for working the searchlights etc., and finally tables for the winter routine and for gunnery drills. Undoubtedly only a very limited number of copies of this manual were printed for the use of the more senior officers - the ship had a total complement of 402 officers and men.

HMS Dreadnought was a turret ironclad battleship with muzzle-loading guns built at Pembroke Dockyard. She began as the Fury in 1870, was renamed and laid down in 1872, launched in 1875 and completed in 1879. In 1884 she joined the Mediterranean Fleet based in Malta, where she remained for the next ten years. During part of this period, the future King George Vth served in her as a Lieutenant. She returned to British waters in 1894 and after a refit served as a coastguard ship in Bantry Bay. After further modernisation she took part in fleet manoeuvres in 1901-02 as a second-class battleship. She was decommissioned in 1905 and was finally scrapped in 1908.
